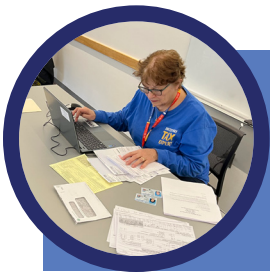
United is the Way we ensure everyone has the resources they need to thrive.

Last year, United Way's tax volunteers served 12,720 clients helping claim more than **\$15.7 million** in returns!



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP): We work to educate and connect families across the county to SNAP through broad outreach and awareness campaigns about eligibility, guidance, tools, and support to navigate the complex application process.
